Healthcare Workers

Pandemic influenza A H1N1 is likely to cause another serious influenza illness season this year, so it is important that all healthcare workers are vaccinated against pandemic influenza A H1N1.

The healthcare workers need to be healthy themselves to care for sick people and prevent them contracting the disease from clients or them spreading the disease to their clients/patients and family members.

Healthcare workers are priority group for vaccination in order to secure the health care system incase of a more virulent Pandemic Influenza A H1N1 Virus occurrence in future.



Pregnant Women

Observations worldwide has shown that pregnant mothers who get pandemic influenza A H1N1 can become very ill and even die.

It is important that you receive pandemic influenza A H1N1 vaccine during your pregnancy to protect you and your baby.



People with Chronic Medical Conditions

Persons with chronic medical condition can get very sick and even die if they get pandemic influenza A H1N1.

If you suffer from chronic medical conditions like Cancer, Diabetes, Heart disease, Sickle Cell disease, HIV and AIDS then get vaccinated. It will protect you from the pandemic influenza A H1N1.

Community Members

Community members like you can encourage high risk persons (pregnant women, people with chronic medical conditions and even healthcare workers) to get the pandemic influenza A H1N1 vaccine. The vaccine is made like other flu vaccines that have been used for years in the World. Millions of people in Countries around the World have received the pandemic influenza A H1N1 vaccine since October 2009.
